GUIDELINES FOR ENTERING CONTESTS

The deadline for submission of all manuscripts is:

Tuesday, March 21, 2023

Students may enter as many contests as they wish; however, each contest requires its own unique entry. The same manuscript **cannot** be submitted for more than one award. In addition, multiple entries for a single award are not permitted: **one manuscript for each award.**

The manuscript title and the name of the award sought must appear on each manuscript's first page. With the exception of the Goodman Fund Grant entries, **all manuscripts must be submitted without the name of the author anywhere on the manuscript.**

All manuscripts must be double-spaced (poetry may be single-spaced) and typed in a standard font such as Times New Roman.

Submit manuscripts as a .pdf or a Word document via email to Ms. Yana Joseph at vjoseph@ccny.cuny.edu.

Letters requesting consideration for the various Awards for General Excellence should be addressed to the Mack Committee and emailed to Ms. Yana Joseph at vjoseph@ccny.cuny.edu.

Each entry must include a separate document containing the following information:

- Name
- Full Address (including zip code)
- Telephone Number(s)
- I.D. Number (CUNYFirst EMPLID)
- E-Mail Address
- Name of Award
- Title of the Manuscript

The winners will be notified by mid-April. All winning manuscripts will be considered for publication in *Promethean*.

Graduate (Award: \$5000)

For the most accomplished piece of work by a student in the Graduate Program in Creative Writing.

The Doris Lippman Prize will be awarded for the most accomplished manuscript selected from the Dortort and Dejur Prize submissions.

THE DAVID DORTORT PRIZE IN CREATIVE WRITING

Graduate (Award: one in non-fiction & one in playwriting, each award \$2,000) *

For accomplished individual pieces of work.

THE JEROME LOWELL DEJUR PRIZE IN CREATIVE WRITING

Graduate (Award: one in poetry & one in fiction, each award \$2,000) *

For accomplished individual pieces of work.

** The Dejur & Dortort prizes require submission of a significant manuscript. Students submitting in more than one genre will need to submit separate manuscripts.*

Page requirement for a significant manuscript:

30-40 pages for a poetry submission

minimum 80 pages for fiction (DeJur) or non-fiction (Dortort) submissions

Excerpt from a novel is accepted.

THE GOODMAN FUND GRANTS

Graduate or Graduating Seniors (Award: one or more prizes up to \$200)

Those interested in applying for this grant should submit an example of their work (published or unpublished), a letter of reference, and a statement concerning the creative project to be accomplished.

THE GOODMAN FUND SHORT STORY AWARD

Undergraduate (Award: \$200)

For an outstanding short story by an undergraduate. Only one short story may be submitted by each student.

THE GRADUATE CHILDREN'S WRITING AWARD

Graduate (Award: \$100)

For an excellent children's picture book, story, chapter book or "young adult" (YA) book by a graduate student.

THE UNDERGRADUATE CHILDREN'S WRITING AWARD

Undergraduate (Award: \$100)

For an excellent children's picture book, story, chapter book or "young adult" (YA) book by an undergraduate student.

POETRY AWARDS

THE DAVID MARKOWITZ POETRY AWARD

Undergraduate (Award: \$200)

For outstanding poetry by an undergraduate. Submit between 5 and 12 pages.

THE ESTHER UNGER POETRY PRIZE

Undergraduate (Award: \$200)

For an undergraduate whose work addresses significant local or international social issues (though not necessarily political themes), or that honestly confronts the reality of our common human condition.

THE GOODMAN FUND POETRY AWARD

Undergraduate (Award: \$200)

For outstanding poetry by an undergraduate. Submit between 5 and 12 pages.

ESSAY AWARDS

THE ALLAN DANZIG MEMORIAL AWARD IN VICTORIAN & ROMANTIC LITERATURE

Undergraduate (Award: \$200)

For the best essay by an undergraduate on Romantic or Victorian Literature.

THE DAVID MARKOWITZ ESSAY AWARD

Undergraduate (Award: \$150)

For the best essay by an undergraduate on any poem or poetical topic.

THE RIGGS GOLD MEDAL ESSAY AWARD

Undergraduate (Award: \$200)

For the best biographical or personal essay by an undergraduate.

THE MEYER COHN GRADUATE ESSAY AWARD IN LITERATURE

Graduate (Award: \$200)

For the best essay in literary criticism. An M.A. graduate thesis will not be considered.

THE IRWIN AND ALICE STARK AWARDS

THE STARK SHORT FICTION PRIZE

Graduate and Undergraduate (Award: \$200 each)

For an outstanding work of short fiction (e.g., a short story or novella).

THE STARK AWARD IN FICTION IN HONOR OF HENRY R. ROTH

Undergraduate (Award: \$200)

For the year's best work in short fiction by an undergraduate.

THE STARK AWARD IN DRAMA IN MEMORY OF ROSS ALEXANDER

Graduate or Undergraduate (Award: \$200)

For excellence in playwriting by an undergraduate or graduate student. Submit either a one-act or a full-length play.

THE STARK POETRY PRIZE IN MEMORY OF RAYMOND PATTERSON

Graduate (Award: \$200)

For outstanding poetry by a graduate student. Submit between 5 and 12 pages.

THE STARK ESSAY AWARD IN LITERATURE

Undergraduate (Award: \$200)

For the best essay on literature.

THE STARK ENGLISH COMPOSITION AWARD IN MEMORY OF MINA SHAUGHNESSY

Undergraduate (Award: \$200)

For the best student essay(s) written in Freshman Composition class. Manuscripts must be submitted by the instructor ONLY.

AWARDS FOR GENERAL EXCELLENCE

THE JULIUS AND ELIZABETH ISAACS SCHOLARSHIP

Recipients of the Isaacs Scholarship are outstanding freshmen or sophomores at City College, with a 3.3 overall GPA and a 3.5 GPA in English courses. Isaacs Scholars major in English Literature, write an Honors thesis, and study a classical language as well, typically Latin.

(Stipend: \$2500 per semester)

Letters requesting consideration for the following Awards for General Excellence and recommendation letters should be addressed to the Mack Committee and emailed to Ms. Yana Joseph at yjoseph@ccny.cuny.edu.

THE DAVID DORTORT UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

Undergraduate (Award: \$1,500)

One scholarship for an outstanding sophomore or junior English major in creative writing.

Applicant must have a 3.5 minimum GPA. To apply, students must submit the following:

An application letter stating the student's name, contact information and intention to apply for an award
Letters of recommendation from TWO faculty members

THE LILLIAN FEDER SCHOLARSHIP

Graduate or Undergraduate (Scholarship for one year, or stipend prorated in the amount of full-time in-state tuition). A merit scholarship for an undergraduate student concentrating in literature, or a graduate student in the MA in Literature.

Applicant must have a 3.7 minimum GPA, and should submit a letter of interest stating eligibility, merit and need, and providing the names of three City College faculty who can address merit and qualifications.

THE MARILYN STERNGLOSS AWARDS IN LANGUAGE AND LITERACY:

THE MARILYN STERNGLOSS WRITING AWARD

Graduate (Award: \$500)

Presented to a matriculated Fall 2022 or Spring 2023 graduate student in the CCNY English Department MA in L&L, MA in Literature or MFA in Creative Writing for an essay, report, or story submitted for credit in a Language and Literacy graduate course *during any semester that the student was a matriculated graduate student*.

THE MARILYN STERNGLOSS OVERALL MERIT AWARD

Graduate (Award: \$500)

Presented to a matriculated Language and Literacy MA student who enrolled in courses during the Fall 2022 or Spring 2023 or both semesters.

To apply for this award, a student will submit the following documents to Yana Joseph (yjoseph@ccny.cuny.edu):

* an application letter (addressed to Ms. Yana Joseph, Administrative Manager, English Department, City College of New York) stating the student's name, contact information and intention to apply for the Marilyn Sternglass Overall Merit Award;

* a current CV with updated information about education, employment, publications, conference presentations, grants, scholarships, awards, professional community service;

* an up-to-date CCNY graduate transcript;

* a 500-750 words personal essay in which the applicant discusses the following topics:

1. academic achievements as an L&L MA student (courses taken, grades, GPA);
2. professional and academic goals (as an MA student & as a future graduate);
3. professional activities while enrolled in L&L MA (e.g., attending workshops, professional talks, & conferences);
4. professional accomplishments (grants, scholarships, professional conference, participation, publications, invited talks/presentations);
5. professional community service/volunteer work related to graduate studies (e.g., reviewing manuscripts submitted for a journal, attending new student orientations and recruitment events, volunteer tutoring for CityTutors, Literacy Partners, a public library, or another organization);
6. an essay or research report submitted for credit in an L&L MA graduate course (*without* instructor's comments or grade).

THE EDWARD C. AND RUTH P. MACK GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP

Graduating Senior (Award: \$500)

For one or two graduating English majors who have demonstrated excellence, a potential for scholarship, and require assistance in pursuing graduate study in English. (Preference will be given to students who have been accepted into a graduate English program.) Students must have GPAs over 3.5. To apply, students must submit the following:

An application letter stating the student's name, contact information and intention to apply for an award
Letters of recommendation from TWO faculty members
If applicable, a letter of acceptance into the proposed graduate English program.

THE PAUL ROBERTS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Undergraduate (Award: \$500)

A scholarship for an English major based on academic performance and demonstrated financial need. Students must have GPAs over 3.5 to apply for this scholarship and must submit the following:

An application letter stating the student's name, contact information and intention to apply for an award
Letters of recommendation from TWO faculty members.

THE RICHARD SHEPARD AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN WRITING

Undergraduate (Award: \$500)

One award for an undergraduate who is going into his or her senior year, who has taken two creative writing classes, and who has demonstrated excellence in essays. To apply, students must submit the following:

An application letter stating the student's name, contact information and intention to apply for an award
A sample essay.

THE TONI CADE BAMBARA ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Undergraduate (Award: \$500)

For an undergraduate full-time student in his or her senior year who has been accepted into a graduate program and who intends to be a writer. To apply, students must submit the following

- An application letter stating the student's name, contact information and intention to apply for an award
- Letters of recommendation from TWO faculty members
- A letter of acceptance into the proposed graduate program.

THE WILLIAM BRADLEY OTIS FELLOWSHIP IN AMERICAN LITERATURE

Graduating Senior (Award: \$200)

For a graduating senior who has performed outstandingly in American Literature courses.

To apply, students must submit the following:

- An application letter stating the student's name, contact information and intention to apply for an award
- Letters of recommendation from TWO faculty members.

THE MARGARET HALMY PRIZE

Undergraduate (Award: \$500)

A prize to an undergraduate who is interested in the pursuit of creative or professional writing as a career and who is the first generation in his or her family to pursue a college degree.

To apply, submit a personal narrative of 500-1250 words detailing eligibility, ambitions and goals, and providing the names of three City College faculty who can address the quality of your work.

THE ALBERT FRIEND AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN MEDIEVAL STUDIES

Graduate or Graduating Senior (Award: \$100)

For a graduating senior or a graduate student demonstrating excellence in medieval studies. To apply, students must submit the following:

- An application letter stating the student's name, contact information and intention to apply for an award
- At least one essay in the subject area.

TEACHING AWARDS

THE NORMAN LEVINE OUTSTANDING TEACHING AWARD

Graduate (Award: \$500)

For a City College Department of English graduate student who has demonstrated excellence in teaching City College undergraduates. Consideration by faculty nomination.

THE TEACHER-WRITER AWARD

Graduate (Award: \$500)

For promise of a career combining dedicated teaching with achievement in creative writing or scholarship
Consideration by faculty nomination.
